The results of the meeting will be used in the development of the NAC's National Operational Plan. The IECC is pleased to be in process of buffering its membership to include the participation of experts in the area of Desk Top Publishing, Television Production, Marketing, Public Relations, Graphic Designs and Multimedia to become more effective gatekeepers of quality public messages.



What is new with the CDB Grant?



The National AIDS Secretariat, on behalf of the National AIDS Commission and all our partners in the national response, has submitted to the Caribbean Development Bank a request for resumption of the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) Grant No. 25, *Control and Prevention of HIV/AIDS in Belize*.

The grant includes funds for the continuation or completion of three sub-projects in Belize as follows:

1. The expansion of the MOL's Workplace Policy and Education Project

2. The completion of the National AIDS Commission's Legal Review Project

3. The security upgrade of the computer network at the National AIDS Commission Secretariat.

The Secretariat has put together an updated request with all related documentation and now awaits a response from CDB on the final disbursement of funds initially

approved for this project.

Belize's Very Own - POWA Wins UNDP's 2010 Red Ribbon Award



Productive Organization for Women in Action (POWA), a grassroots organization based in Stann Creek, wins the UNDP's 2010 Red Ribbon Award in Belize and the Caribbean.

POWA is one of twenty-five community-based organizations representing 17 countries around the world who were recipients of the 2010 Red Ribbon that recognizes outstanding community organizations for their work in reducing the spread and impact of AIDS.

The winners receive a cash award and will be recognized internationally for their leadership in responding to the AIDS epidemic at the XVIII International AIDS Conference held in Vienna (July 18-23).

POWA and 24 other winners were chosen from a pool of 720 nominations from more than 100 countries. The winners were primarily judged in

terms of innovation, impact, sustainability, strategic partnerships, gender sensitivity and social inclusion.

This CBO's work include advocacy campaigns on HIV and STI prevention, sexual reproductive health, human rights, genderbased violence, sexual abuse and exploitation, gender equality and stigma and discrimination.

The Red Zone is also used as a fundraising drive to collect much needed resources to assist those in dire need. As always, the booth was visited by an overwhelming number of visitors making the San Pedro AIDS Commission able to say, "*We've done it again, making another positive impact in our community!*"

PASMO Continues to Partner with POWA to Deliver Valuable Outreach Programs to Benefit Stann Creek Communities

Belize's 2010 UNGASS Report highlights the highter incidence of HIV/AIDS in the Belize and Stann Creek Districts.

In response, PASMO continues to partner with POWA under the UNAIDS funded project to deliver critically needed outreach services in Stann Creek responding to the prevention education needs and overall sexual and reproductive health (SRH) issues of the communities of this district.

Over the last several weeks, PASMO educators in collaboration with POWA has been conducting condom demonstrations and advocacy work combating gender-based violence, stigma and discrimination while visiting public areas such as bars restaurants, and large gatherings at key public events.

This Behavior Change Communications (BCC) program is conducted every two weeks focusing in towns and villages in Stann Creek such as Dangriga, Hopkins, St. Beight, Georgetown and Placencia Village.

Other high risk populations targeted via their satellite tables include male and female sex workers. PASMO hopes to be able to reach out to Men who have sex with Men (MSMs).



REDCA+ Meets in Panama to Further Proposal Development for GFATM Round Ten

In the preceding two days, REDCA+ held its XIV Ordinary Meeting on July 12 & 13 to conduct a comprehensive review of their goals and commitments yet to be fulfilled. This meeting included much discourse among its members on development issues and the way forward for increased engagement of individual members and groups to the benefit of the organization.

Influencial speakers addressed the conference including the former U.S. President Bill Clinton and Philanthropist Bill Gates.

Other powerful remarks at opening session include those of Julio Montaner, President of the International AIDS Society and Director of the BC Center for Excellence in HIV/AIDS in Vancouver, Canada who said:

"I cannot hide my profound disappointment and frustration with the recently concluded G8/G20 meeting in Canada. By failing to take responsibility for the universal access pledge, and more importantly for failing to articulate next steps to meet not just the 6th Millennium Development Goal but all of them by 2015, the G8 has, quite simply, failed us."
